Dr. Febbo has received a number of honors and awards including the NIH Funding through RO! and U01 grants, a Prostate Cancer Foundation Challenge Award, the Damon Runyon Cancer Research Foundation Clinical Investigator Award, and several Department of Defense awards including a New Investigator Award. Idea Development Award and Physician Research Training Award.
